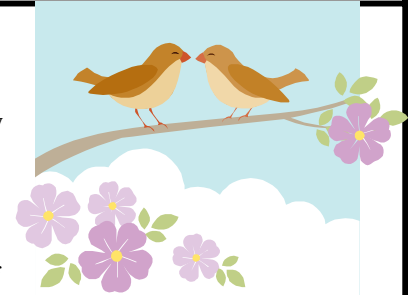

Greetings In Christ!

Please read the following article written by Rev. Harlene Sadler, Pastor at the First United Methodist Church of Eagle Pass, Texas. As many of you know, Pastor Harlene was recommended for United Methodist Ministry when she lived in San Saba and was a member of our Church. The title of her article, which was published in the April 25, 2008 *United Methodist Witness*, "Southwest Texas Conference News", (Volume 9, Number 22, Page 3) is "Early responders clean Eagle Pass".



"Offering Christ to All" became more than words to those of us last year in Eagle Pass when a tornado ripped through our area. It hit dead-on in a local Colonia named Rosita Valley. Seven people were killed on the American side of the Rio Grande and at least three people were reported having died across the river in Mexico."

"Devastation was everywhere. What little these people had was wadded up in misshapen forms and tossed about like confetti. We hardly had time to take it in before phone calls began. "How can we help?" "What can we do?" Expressions of concern came pouring in, along with checks that invited us to help in any way we could."

"Initially, the Early Response teams came in with gear for clean up. People from as far away as Kansas and Oklahoma, and as near as San Antonio and Bulverde came "to offer Christ to all."

"We began the work of salvaging what we could and rebuilding where it was feasible. And when reconstruction was not possible, we would start from scratch. To date, we have built five new homes from the foundation up, and more are in process."

"We have assisted more than 30 families with projects that ranged from re-screening windows to re-roofing all, or portions, of their homes. All of this has been completely done with free labor from caring hearts."

"More than 4,500 hours of donated labor and thousands of dollars have been invested in Rosita Valley. Close to 90 percent of the time and money has come from our Methodist churches."

"All of this was given in God's name. And it was difficult for the people to believe that nothing was required in return. In God's name you provided extraordinary hope in the midst of incredible chaos."

"I wish I could tell you that it was over. Unfortunately, there are 80 or 90 families that still need help. If you can help, please call Amy Garcia at (830) 776-4126 or (830) 773-3409. The group's e-mail address is interfaithcomm@gmail.com."
