Greetings In Christ!

Thanks for all the calls, cards, food, and prayers, which have helped me tremendously to recover from whatever form of the flu I contracted. Also, I appreciate your warm welcome, and the hospitality extended to Rev. Don Graham on October 25, 2009.

We shall be participating again this year in "Home for Christmas", which will include a Christmas Eve Candlelight Worship Service. The Southwest Texas Conference Igniting Ministry Campaign has compiled a 'workbook', which we shall follow to some extent this year to maximize the number of first-time visitors to our Church on Christmas Eve. The following is an edited version of the invitation process:

"I hope you will pray daily for this evangelistic outreach. Our "Home for Christmas" outreach is part of a coordinated effort by United Methodists across Southwest Texas. That puts our commitment to make disciples of Christ into action as we invite unchurched people to worship on Christmas Eve."

"Research shows that unchurched people are more willing to visit a church for the first time on Christmas Eve than at any other time of the year. That makes Christmas Eve one of our best opportunities to influence people toward making a spiritual connection with the Christ of Christmas."

"We're asking you to supply the names and addresses of three households you know that don't regularly attend church. Don't include our inactive members on your list. We know where they live. Don't be concerned about these people finding out who gave us their names. We won't use your name in any way when we mail the invitation Christmas cards."

"Think of family members – spouse, parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, cousins, in-laws, nephews, and nieces. Think of neighbors – next-door neighbors, elderly people in the neighborhood, and new families on the block. Think of people you know through sports or hobbies – people with whom you play golf, play tennis or attend craft classes – or parents of players on your children's sports teams."

"Think especially of people who are undergoing personal life stresses of some kind. Those individuals often find helpful answers to their problems from within the Christian faith – people who are recently divorced, families with new babies, families that have experienced a recent death, families where someone has lost a job or suffered painful business reversals."

Opportunities for Giving at FUMC

Our church has always been a generous church. Even in these days of increased expenses we are meeting all of our obligations and are without debt, but we are running slightly behind on our anticipated income for the first three quarters of 2009. Your Finance Committee worked on the proposed budget for the **General Fund** at its recent meeting. It looks like we will need to budget about \$133,000 for operating expenses in 2010, an increase of \$3000. There are other expenses, such as insurance premiums that may also increase so we hope everyone will increase their giving plan for 2010 just a little bit.

In addition to the regular planned contributions to the **General Fund**, there have been regular gifts to the **St. Stephens Fund** through the altar rail offering on Communion Sunday for local mission ministries. Gifts to the **Youth Fund** have been received in support of Faith Weaver Friends and Camp Scholarships. Of course there are also occasional contributions to the **Memorial and Endowment Funds**. Most of the activity in the **Capital Improvement Fund** has been the completion of the Video Projection System and the purchase of banners to beautify the sanctuary as a result of a gift for that purpose.

Consecration Sunday gives you a wonderful opportunity to make your own personal giving commitments for next year. You will be indicating your gifts to the **General Fund** on Consecration Sunday, but please remember these other opportunities for giving during the year.

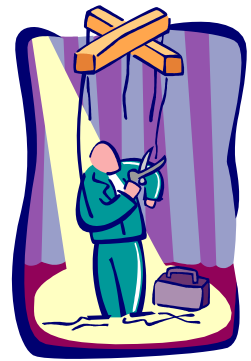

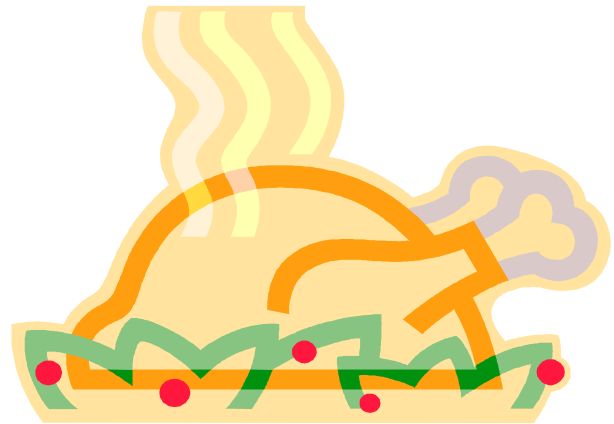
